## July through September 2023 Open Report

This reporting period encompasses the Second Quarter reporting period for RCMP's fiscal year. The second quarter extends from July to September 2023. The intent of this report is to provide a brief overview of policing, to Leadership of the Cowichan Valley, which the North Cowichan/Duncan RCMP Detachment serves.

#### Calls For Service:

Between July and September 2023, **5413** calls for service were received. Trend is flat against same time period in 2022 (eg: **5440** calls for service in 2022). However, there is a 3.9% increase in call volume in 2023 YTD vs. 2022 YTD.

Crimes Against Persons occurrences were up in all jurisdictions from 354 to 384 (+8%).

- Assaults increased 12%.
- Sex Offences were down 13%
- Extortion files were up 22% (from 9 to 11 files). "Sextortion" incidents are the majority of these types of files.

Person Crime types are also trending upward in YTD comparison to 2022.

Crimes Against Property occurrences were down 14% from 846 to 727 files).

- Auto Theft files decreased by 29% (down from 24 to 17 files).
- Shoplifting decreased 48% (193 to 100 files).

Property Crime types are also trending downward in YTD comparison to 2022.

There were zero **Fatal Motor Collisions** between July - September 2023 compared with 2 fatal motor collisions for 2023 year to date..

**Impaired Operation** of Motor Vehicle investigations decreased by 11% (from 87 to 77 files) compared to an upward trend 2023 YTD.

**Missing Persons** investigations increased by 17% (from 99 to 116 files). All persons reported missing this year have been located. There are **5** previously reported missing person investigations (dated prior to 2021). All are being actively investigated.

False Alarms decreased by 5% increase (from 207 to 196 files).



### Mental Health:

Mental Health files are defined as files with a UCR code under the Mental Health Act <u>OR</u> files that contained the study flag "Mental Health Related". Unfounded and unsubstantiated events were not included in these numbers. From July to September 2023, Sec 28 Apprehensions decreased by 37%, from **130** to **82** calls for service.




For the Quarter, the average hospital wait time for Section 28 Mental Health Apprehensions from "Time of Arrival at Hospital" to "Time of Transfer from Police Custody to Hospital" was down to an average of 63 minutes. This is down from the first quarter (April to June) by 10 mins.

## Distribution of Calls For Service:

The chart below illustrates where our calls for service originate in our Detachment area. We have a total of 63 RCMP Officers providing 24/7 Policing coverage. From January to June 2023, **51**% of the calls we responded to were from within the Municipality of North Cowichan Policing jurisdiction. That **20**% came from the City of Duncan, **15**% came from the Cowichan Tribes/Indigenous Lands, **9**% came from the Provincial (CVRD) area and **5**% were reported directly to the Detachment (North Cowichan).
