So many folks are living right on the edge, from income to income and with rising rents, food costs, fuel and interest rates it's fair to say many constituents are stretched to the max. Constituents paying for water overages this winter would do nothing to bring the water back and it could cause increased stress, hardship and pressure on many of them as they navigate this unprecedented time. Wages, pensions and social assistance are in no way what they should be when juxtaposed with the costs of everything.

I appreciate your consideration of this request, for the sake of people who need it. My request is that you make it universal this winter in this incredibly cold time.
