

## 2024 First Quarter Report North Cowichan Fire Department

May 15, 2024 Regular Council Meeting

## Administration: Structure and Leadership

- A new leadership structure has been implemented. The Chief Officer Group includes the Fire Chief, Deputy Fire Chief of Inspections/Investigations, Deputy Fire Chief of Operations/Training Officer, the four Station Chiefs and four Station Deputy Chiefs.
- Standard Operational Guidelines (SOGs) are now in place to bring firefighters up to current standards. Further updating review will be taking place as implementation of the guidelines takes place.
  - Senior firefighters from each station will be part of the SOG committee to assist with the development and review of any new guidelines being considered.
- Tim Pley & Associates is working on the five-year strategic plan. The plan will examine staffing, current station locations, levels of service, response times, budget implications, and other issues. This project includes senior municipal staff. The plan is expected to be completed in Quarter 2 for Council consideration.

## Staffing and Firefighter Recruitment

- Chris Jancowski has been selected as the new Deputy Fire Chief in charge of training and operations. He brings over 30 years of experience to the position working with a variety of organizations with the past 18 years in senior leadership roles within the fire service. We are very pleased to have Chris as part of our team.
- North Cowichan Fire Department (NCFD) and CUPE 358 have formed a Labour Relations
  Committee identifying shop stewards in each fire station.
- The NCFD Labour Relations Committee, which includes North Cowichan Human Resources and CUPE 358 representatives, meets bi-monthly to discuss items as they arise and develop working relationships between operations and associations.



### Administration: Communications

- The Fire Chief is currently working with North Cowichan Communications Department to develop an information distribution plan and communication strategy for North Cowichan residents and business owners.
- One of the outstanding recommendations coming from the Tim Pley & Associates report was to develop a plan to be able to share all information with all North Cowichan Paid On-Call firefighters.
- Work has started between the North Cowichan IT Department and the Fire Department on creating an internal SharePoint that firefighters and officers can access. This communication strategy will enhance the capability of accessing information remotely, such as reviewing SOGs.






## 2023 Total Dispatched from North Island Dispatch






## 2023 Fire Incident Calls from North Island Dispatch














## 2024 Quarter 1 Total Incident Calls









## 2024 Quarter 1 Monthly Comparison by Station



## 2024 Quarter 1 Incident Calls by Type



  - Schedule firehall tours and information sessions in response to anticipated requests from local primary schools and summer camps.
  - Initiated plans for Fire Prevention Week education program and Fire Prevention Officers' school visits in the Fall.
- Office of the Fire Commissioner pilot project:
  - A partnership with the OFC is in process for a pilot project for smoke detectors is in process.
  - This will be for the Crofton community for the fall of 2024.
