YEAR END REPORT

January 2023 through March 2024
Open Report

North Cowichan Duncan RCMP service to the community:

- 1. NCD Plainclothes & IPS Unit members arrested parents in relation to the sudden death of a 6 yo child from 2021. Charges of Manslaughter and Fail to Provide Necessaries for Life were approved by the Crown. The investigation was completed early on, but required a complete review by the Crown's office, given circumstances involved in the file.
- 2. In January, NCD plainclothes and Island ERT executed a successful drug search warrant on a residence located east of the corridor. Warrant was successful in seizing 20-30 grams of fentanyl and a loaded shotgun. The home was fortified but access was gained by members before risk to police could take place, or the disposal of drugs (by the occupants of the home.) City of Duncan bylaw seized the home and boarded it up preventing squatters from getting access.
- 3. In February North Cowichan Duncan RCMP hosted their annual Community Consultative Group meeting to seek out information from community members in order to gather suggestions from the community for our Annual Performance Plan. Many suggestions were received and are being incorporated into proactive policing priorities to address community and social based issues facing NCD community members. A draft of the plan will be available for our community leadership to review, in April.
- 4. "Building Bridges" meetings between our members and those in the community with Lived Experiences continue to be held in order to help reduce anxiety experienced by those from the unhoused community, when in contact with the RCMP. This is an ongoing initiative and has been in place through last year. Will continue going forward. Peer group reports relations have improved significantly as a result of this effort.
- 5. Date for the move into the new detachment has been confirmed for the weekend of May 21, 2024. Delegated duties and responsibilities have been assigned to NCOs to ensure exhibits, weapons, files...etc will be transitioned to the new building in an orderly fashion. Grand opening plans are set for June 14th.
- 6. Our IPS Ceremonial canoe arrived in March. The acquisition of the 30' canoe was requested by our Indigenous Policing Unit to support and participate in Youth and Cultural paddling programs. Submission for the purchase of the canoe was made last Fall and will assist with improving police community relations in steps towards reconciliation. Additionally, having the vessel provides an excellent way to help build strong working relationships between the RCMP and Cowichan Tribes leadership and community due to the common interests and cross cultural training opportunities (traditional canoe races, cultural protocol ceremonies...etc). Dedication, Insignia and emblems celebrating our IPS unit and Cowichan Tribes will be added to the vessel.
- 7. Members were called to search for a 9 yo male this past quarter in Crofton. Unfortunately there was a 3 hour time delay before the report was received by the police. Given the high risk associated, most of the watch was deployed for the search. Lake Cowichan RCMP sent over one of their members to assist two Duncan members responding to calls while the rest of the members were involved in the search. Cowichan Ground Search and Rescue was also deployed. A reach out through social media was coordinated and numerous community members attended in the rain to help with the search. The child was eventually located at another residence in Crofton without incident.

- 8. Our Community Safety Officers (Csts Richens, Jordan and Sanders) are partnering with Municipality of North Cowichan and Municipality of Duncan Bylaw members for foot patrols (and soon to be bike patrols). Regular patrols extended from the TCH near the Casino, through the Village Green mall area, along Duncan Street and across to Lewis and the Corridor area. The group is planning on including a worker from the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction on future patrols. Numerous contacts made and community members appreciated seeing the collaboration between all organizations.
- 9. The detachment is working hard at managing resources at your detachment. While movement is part of the job description for the RCMP, we are also focusing at maintaining and building our roster. We have had 4 new members join us in the last 4 weeks, with three more adding to the watches in May. Ongoing work. Most of the new members are out of Depot so senior detachment trainers have been identified and are guiding and mentoring skill development of the junior members.
- 10. The detachment has been fortunate to hire a local carver who will carve a 12' high totem pole for the new detachment on Ford Rd. It should be ready for mid-summer. It will be a beautiful addition to the new detachment and represents the strong relationship we have with Cowichan Tribes.
- 11.A local Cowichan Tribes artist is designing the artwork for the lobby of the new detachment, and a local elder has provided the language conversion and recording notifications, including our RCMP CORE Values into written and spoken Hul'g'umi'num.
- 12. The North Cowichan Duncan RCMP GIS members are working on a number of sensitive files including two child exploitation files, DNA investigations in which forensic evidence may provided confirmation of suspect identity, and, existing files currently be reviewed by the BCIIO. We are hoping the BCIIO will have outcomes available soon on two high priority investigations from 2023.
- 13.The detachment is working on an official North Cowichan Duncan RCMP social media account through Facebook in order share information with community members. This effort will build on our community relations through posted information on recruiting drives, IPS functions, missing person notifications. The account should be up and running by the end of April.







City of Duncan - Apr 1, 2023 - Mar 31, 2024






City of Duncan - Apr 1, 2023 - Mar 31, 2024






Municipality of North Cowichan - Apr 1, 2023 - Mar 31, 2024

Search warrants executed after drug trafficking investigation

On March 19th 2024, North Cowichan Duncan RCMP partnered with ERT, GVRT, Victoria Police Dept, Sooke RCMP, CFSEU...etc to execute a number of successful search warrants in order to combat drugs and violence in our community. Funding for the project, which culminated in arrests and seizures, was an outcome of securing funding through the BC Government's SITE (Special Investigations & Targeted Enforcement) initiative. The impact of numerous seizures of drugs and guns from drug dealers in the community will have an impact on the safety of community members. Ongoing applications for funding being planned for further projects.

Community members appreciate the presence of each organization as they conduct foot patrols through the downtown core, along TCH, Village Green area and York/Beverly areas. Soon bike patrols will be implemented as well when bike training needs are complete.

Medical staff at the CDH are actively working to limit the time RCMP members must wait with those apprehended under the Mental Health Act before being released back to patrols. In January wait times dropped to an average of 55 minutes per member. In appreciation the detachment dropped off donuts to thank the medical staff for their efforts.
