### Cowichan Bay Office: (1721 E Cowichan Bay Road)

### **Chemainus Office: (9799 Waterwheel Crescent)**

- Proposal to hire VIU 4<sup>th</sup> Year Criminology graduate for summer employment as office coordinator for Chemainus office.
- Worked with Stephanie Ballantyne, president Chamber of Commerce to secure space for Chemainus Community Policing office. Completed.
- Proposal to have an entrance/exit installed for wheelchair/walker access (either elevator or ramp under consideration) this exit is necessary for the overall safety of the day-to-day operation of this CPO.
- Completed 2 interviews for part time office coordinator.
- No further dialogue on the lower-level exit for the CPO.
- 2 Volunteers available to help part time in the office 2 ½ days a week.
- Continue to recruit volunteers.
- Media release to be held once part time office coordinator hired and date of CPO office confirmed.

### **Program Administration:**

### **Block Watch (BW)**

- Membership filed for Block Watch BC for 2022.
- 300 New Block manuals received from E-Division,
- Block Watch Captain in Sahtlam BW Safety grant winner from 2021 received CPTED training from Cpl Cari, next they will be hosting a block watch meeting to share the information.
- Met with two residents of Duncan to discuss starting up a Block Watch in their neighbourhood.
- Continuing with one-on-one meetings with Block Watch Captains/Co-Captains, those interested in start BW up again and those considering it.
- Continue to promote Block Watch on website and social media.
- B.C.A.A. Slow Down signs distributed to the community as needed.
- B.C.A.A. is offering a discount on insurance for BW Members.
- Organize Block Watch files according to area (Chemainus, Crofton, Duncan, Cowichan Bay).
   Ongoing: continue to organize files according to neighborhoods within these areas.



### **Business Watch:**

- CPO to attend follow up meetings to review priorities and work towards meeting these objectives on an ongoing basis.
- Connecting with RCMP Port Alberni and RCMP Kelowna to review their Business Watch/Crime Prevention Program.
- Connecting with Cowichan Chambers of Commerce to host a Business Watch workshop
- Meetings and discussions with Crime Prevention Manager Super Store, Girls and Boys Club, Manager of Whittome and Cowichan Merchant Building, Experience Cycle, Tim Hortons, IRIS Optical, 300 Brae Rd to listen and understand their concerns, looked at CPTED property improvements; cameras, lighting, reinforced locks, gates, checking the building and surrounding areas for access points or areas easy to hide.
- We have Business Watch metal signs which I have offered them to pick up which has both the NC/Duncan RCMP phone # and 911. We will be redesigning these signs and ordering more for distribution to the Business Community.
- Ideally our goal is to engage the business communities in crime prevention in their areas, either through Citizen on Patrol or Business Watch programs.

### Friendly Phones: Total FP clients (12)

- Created new Rack Cards for Free Friendly Phone program, cards given to Cpl Cari, so that the RCMP can distribute them to potential seniors in need of this service.
- We are on the list with VIHA (Vancouver Island Health Authorities) to support clients being released from hospital that need a daily phone call.
- Continue to promote Free Friendly Phones on social media, usedcowichan.com, and our website.
- Rack cards and posters are being distributed within North Cowichan/Duncan area to promote this service. Service advertised in Seniors Resource Directory (distributed by Cowichan Valley Citizen).
