# 4.1 UBC Partnership Group – Draft Forest Management Scenario Review

The UBC team gave a presentation on the four draft Forestry Management scenario options: 1. Status Quo, 2 Reduced Harvest, 3. Active Conservation and 4. Passive

Conservation, noting that they are simply points of reference, to explain to Council, staff and the community prior to making decisions.

The committee discussed each scenario, noting the many different variables that could affect outcomes. They also noted the importance of receiving input from the public about what they would like to see.

The UBC team will present to Council at the October 4, 2022 Regular Council meeting for Council's consideration and feedback before the public engagement phase. Staff reminded the committee of an ongoing dialogue with First Nations about future forestry practices in the Municipal Forest Reserve which will need to be considered prior to creating an operational forest management plan.
